**EMILY JUNG, MSE, CPS**

Emily is the CEO/COO of ARCHway. She is also a Certified Peer Specialist and a founding member of MO-PROS and NPRA. Emily taught for six years in the Parkway School District in St. Louis.

As a previous public school teacher and through her own experience, she sees the need for open and honest communication about addiction and mental health. She believes these conversations need to happen in schools, in homes, and in the public to bring awareness and understanding, to prevent overdoses and future use, and to bring knowledge of the resources and treatment opportunities that are available.



**JORDAN HAMPTON, CPS**

Jordan Hampton is a Certified Peer Specialist and Advocate for HOPE with ARCHway Institute. Through his work with ARCHway, Jordan works with PreventEd in their GuidEd program. This program allows him to work with adolescents who may be at risk for future substance use disorders.

He is also the Executive Director of Recovery House of STL, which houses nearly 140 men, a MCRSP Board Member, and a consultant with the Missouri Institute for Mental Health.

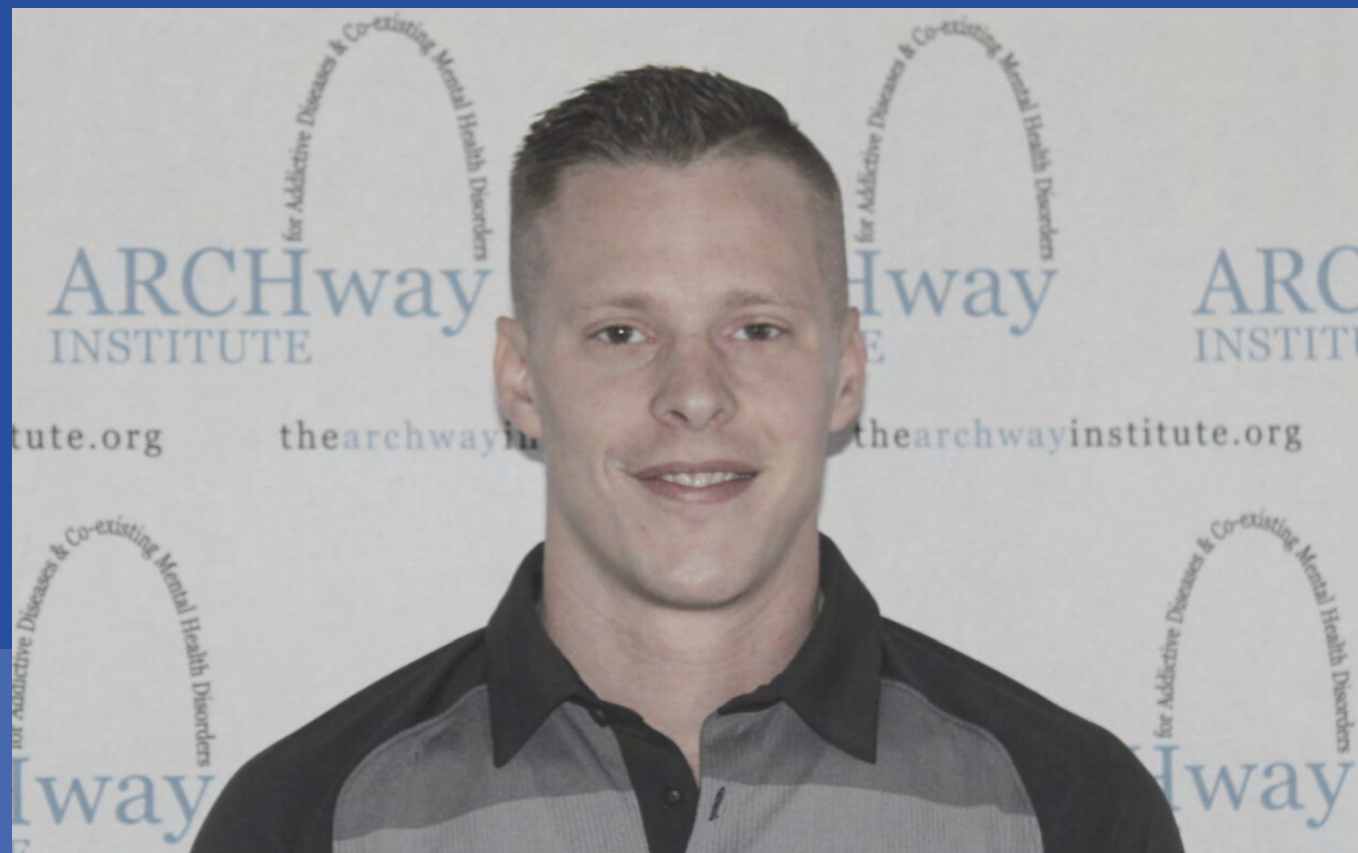

The book starts out with ARCHway's founder, John Stuckey. It explains his journey from addiction to recovery while intertwining 10 or so additional peer recovery stories and stories from caregivers including John's parents, Dan and Jan Stuckey.

During this part of the book, the reader is educated on the realities of addiction through these personal stories. They begin to see that addiction is a disease, not a choice. They learn that the symptoms of addiction include more than the physical and behavioral; they include financial, spiritual, etc. They also see the different pathways individuals have taken to reach recovery: medication-assisted treatment, peer services, recovery housing, 12-step programming, and more. It provides a lot of hope that recovery is possible, and it showcases the faces and voices of those in recovery.

Part of John's recovery included starting ARCHway as a way of giving back and supporting others on their journey to recovery, so the book elaborates on how and why ARCHway started along with how it has gotten to where it is today as a successful non-profit that is working tirelessly to help people struggling with substance use disorders. It really focuses on the work ARCHway does to bring the community together to fight the addiction epidemic.
