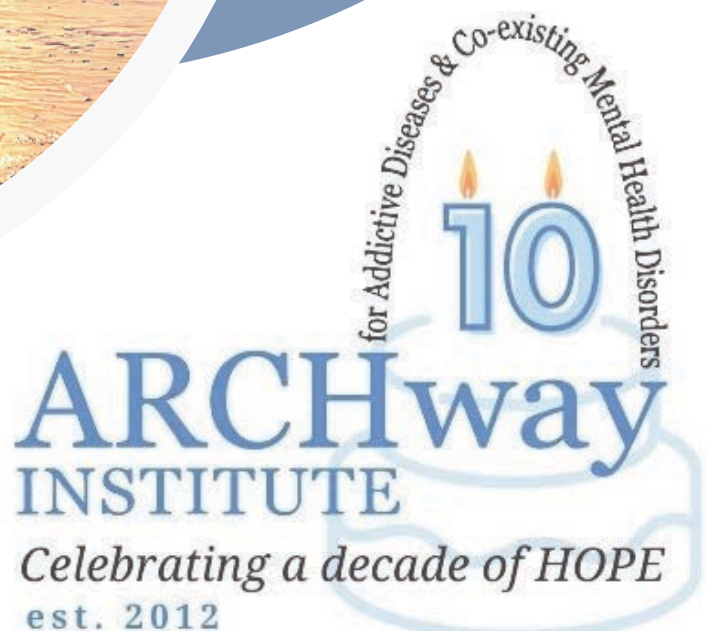

# Our Why

1 in 3 families is directly impacted by substance use disorders (SUD).

1 in 10 individuals in the US has a SUD, and less than 20% actually seek treatment.

There were an estimated 100,306 drug overdose deaths in the US during the 12-month period ending April 2021, an increase of 28.5% from the 78,056 deaths during the same period the year before.

Above all, we do this work because we know that recovery is possible when people are provided with the right resources, support, and life-saving care.

# ARCHway's History

2012

## ARCHWAY STARTED FROM A STORY OF HOPE

John Stuckey, ARCHway's founder, is in long-term recovery from opioid use disorder. After five years of suffering, John found recovery through Medication-Assisted Treatment (Vivitrol), recovery housing, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, and peer support.

John went to outpatient treatment at Assisted Recovery Centers of America where he would meet Percy, Judy, and Suneal Menzies. The Menzies showed sincere love and empathy towards the Stuckey family, and they were motivated to help them on their recovery journey. They didn't give up!

John started his recovery journey in 2012 on Thanksgiving Day. With support from ARCA and the love of his family, he was able to spend time with his family that Thanksgiving.

Did you know that ARCHway started with a cup of coffee? In December of 2012, John was eager to give back. He started a coffee business with all proceeds going towards helping people get into recovery housing. His dream would only grow from there!

# 2013- 2014

## **FEBRUARY - 2013**

By February, Suneal had approached John about turning his coffee business into a true non-profit organization. The two founding families would spend each Saturday working on the mission, vision, bylaws, structure, and goals of the organization.



## **MARCH - 2013**

The family goes public! John, Dan, and Jan Stuckey share their story for the first time on a local radio show. ARCHway makes its debut to the world!

## **JUNE 13, 2013**

ARCHway hosts its 1st STL Gala raising \$10,000 to fund recovery.



## **SEPTEMBER 10, 2013**

The organization's 1st official Board of Directors Meeting was held with Phil Traecy as the Chairman

## **SEPTEMBER 26, 2013**

1st Charity Golf Event held in Ohio. This was our 1st partner fundraiser with Glenbeigh Hospital.

## **JUNE 18, 2014**

ARCHway Institute is formally established as a 501(c)3.

## **AUGUST 22, 2014**

ARCHway continues to grow its network in Ohio through appearing on Rock and Recovery Radio.



## **SEPTEMBER - 2014**

Dan Stuckey steps in as Chairman and 3 new board members are added.

## **MARCH 14, 2015**

ARCHway hosts its 1st Charity Golf Event in Florida.

ARCHway HOPE Fund is launched raising a total of \$65,000 in the 1st year!

## **SEPTEMBER 21, 2016**

ARCHway's 1st major Education Event in Marion, OH. in partnership with ADAMH. Author Sam Quinones speaks about his book, *Dreamland*. ARCHway did a total of 5 speaking events in 2016, but this was, by far, the largest!

## **DECEMBER 3, 2016**

ARCHway hosts 1st event in North Carolina -- The Helicopter Golf Ball drop in partnership with the Chapel Hill Carrboro Sunrise Rotary Club and TROSA.

In 2017, ARCHway launched its Speaker Series & other educational materials. This included the "I Wish I Knew" Series for caregiver support.

## **MARCH 2017**

ARCHway partners with Charlotte County Sheriff's Office and Charlotte Behavioral Health Care for the 1st time to do the Florida Golf & Tennis Event.



## **OCTOBER 4, 2017**

ARCHway hosts its 1st event in Colorado thanks to local volunteers, Bill and Sheri Crittendon.

## **DECEMBER 2017**

ARCHway hosts its 1st Holiday HOPE Campaign focused on relapse prevention during the holidays.

## **JANUARY 2018**

ARCHway does another strategic planning session. This plan focused on building ARCHway's Advocates for HOPE Program (peer support).



## **MARCH 2018**

ARCHway presents its 1st award to Don Willey at the 2018 STL Gala.

## **MARCH 23, 2018**

ARCHway hosts its 1st educational event in Arizona in partnership with the OSU Alumni Club. Maurice Clarett spoke at this event.

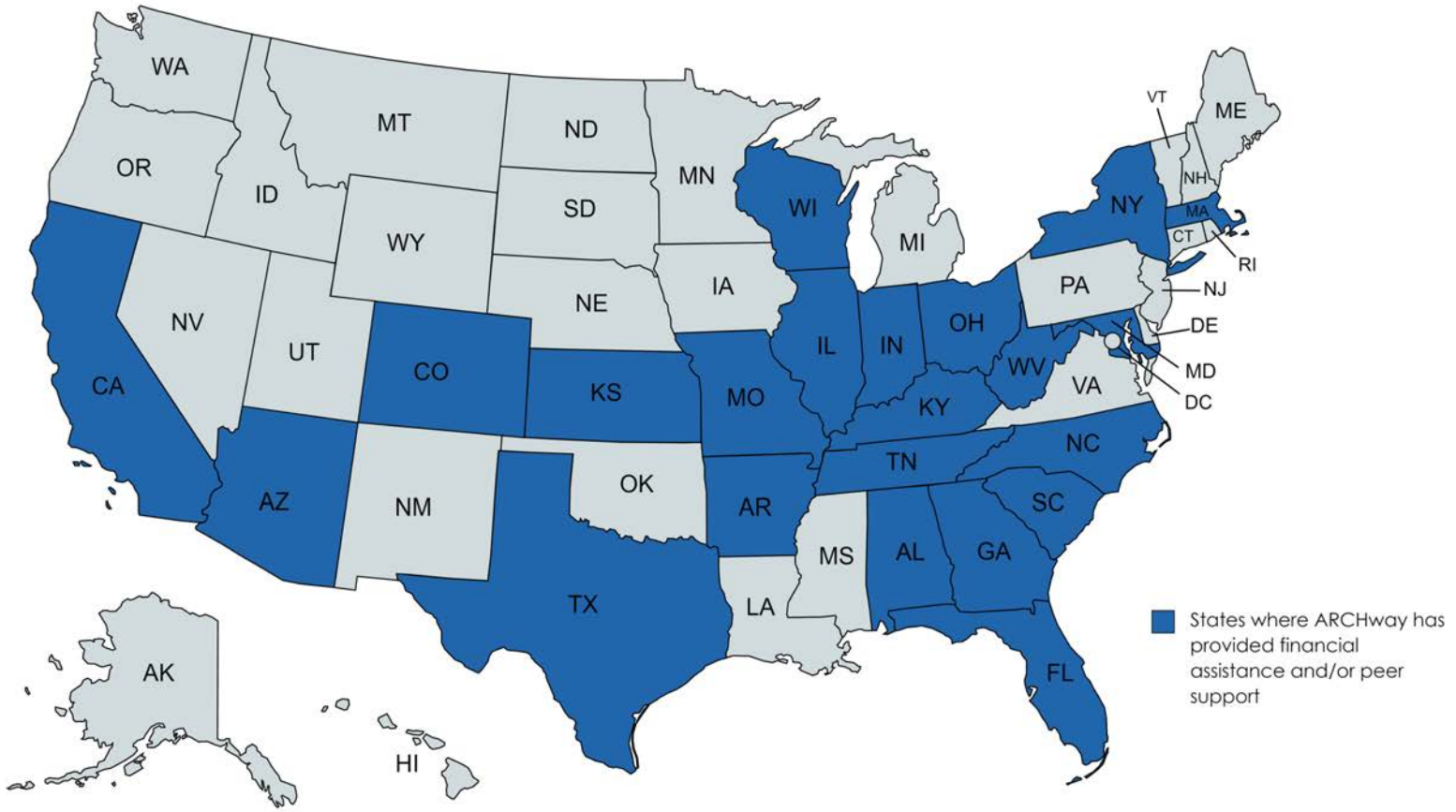

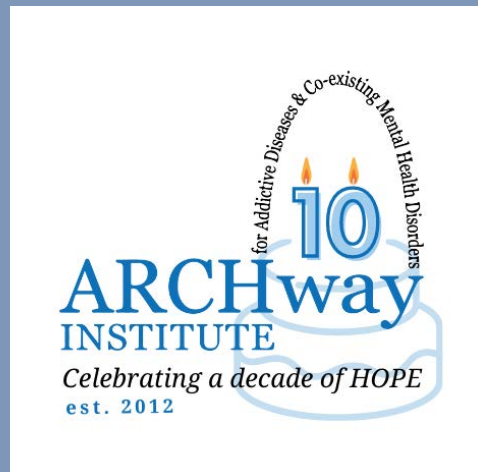
