IN 2021, SAMHSA REPORTED THAT 46.3 MILLION PEOPLE AGED 12 OR OLDER HAD A SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER (SUD). IN ADDITION, 94% OF THOSE WITH A SUD DID NOT RECEIVE ANY TREATMENT.

ARCHway strives to ensure that individuals and families have access to the treatment and recovery services they desperately need in order to recover their lives.

We recognize that in addition to treatment and counseling services, individuals need access to recovery housing and recovery community organizations. They need peer services and mutual aid groups. They need transportation and other essential items. They need educational and/or career opportunities. They need it all!

ARCHway's goal is to increase access to these treatment and recovery services. We do this in a variety of ways. We get out in the community and talk about the different resources that are available. We have one-on-one conversations with families who are struggling letting them know they are not alone and guiding them to the right resources in their local community. Our scholarships provide financial assistance to those seeking services and our grants support strong recovery ecosystems. Our Underwear Drive brings in this much needed essential item for those who've basically lost everything and need a hand up.

Above all, we want you to know that we couldn't do this work without your generous and continued support. Thank you for helping us to increase access to all the treatment and recovery services individuals need to thrive! We appreciate you!

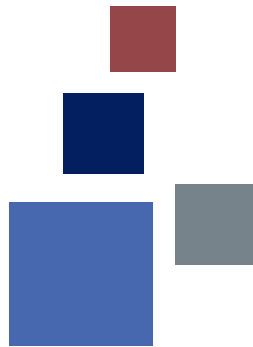

HEALTH

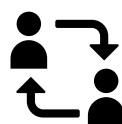
We believe that in order to help people fully recovery their lives, we must focus on the holistic health of the individual. In order to do that, we must strengthen recovery ecosystems within communities.

PEER WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

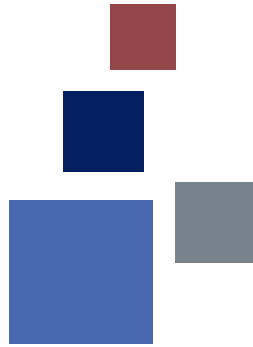
We are working to grow and develop a more unified, empowered peer workforce to support individuals with substance use disorders.

\$360,000 in Donor Support

We raised a total of \$360,000 throughout 2023 to support our educational efforts, peer support, financial assistance, and workforce development for peer support professionals.

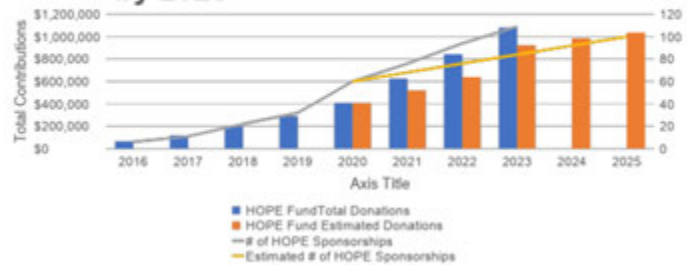
\$235,000 in HOPE Fund Donations

1 Year Reserve

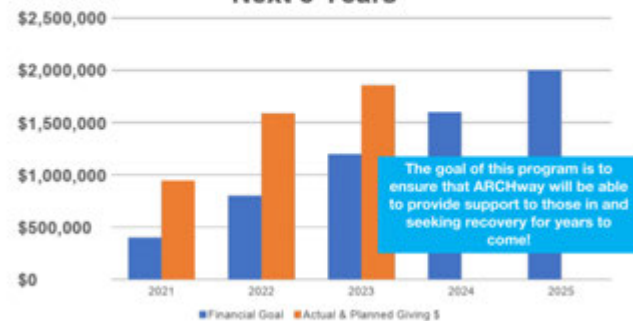
To ensure the sustainability of our organization, the Board of Directors have been able to build a 1 year reserve.

ARCHway's Goal is to Develop \$2 Million in Planned Giving Over The Next 5 Years



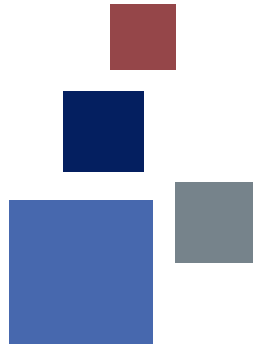
The goal of this program is to ensure that ARCHway will be able to provide support to those in and seeking recovery for years to come!

I did this by having Facebook fundraisers and using that money to help folks get into sober safe living and to treatment, and I even paid an insurance cobra payment. \$100,000 in Grants & Scholarships Released

In 2023, we provided \$100,000 in grants and scholarships to increase access to treatment and recovery services. This was an additional \$30,000 released compared to 2022.

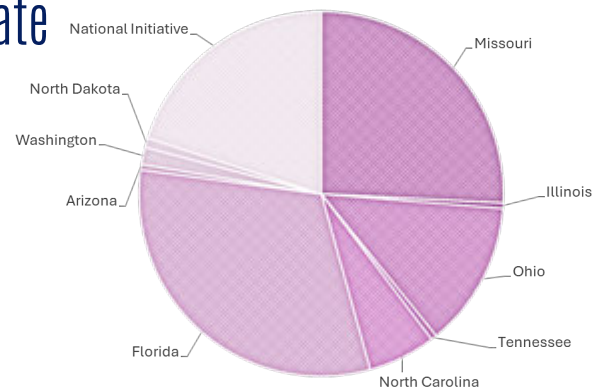
125 Individuals & Families Served

In 2023, we served 125 individuals and families directly through our Advocates for HOPE Program, providing initial peer support and resources connection.

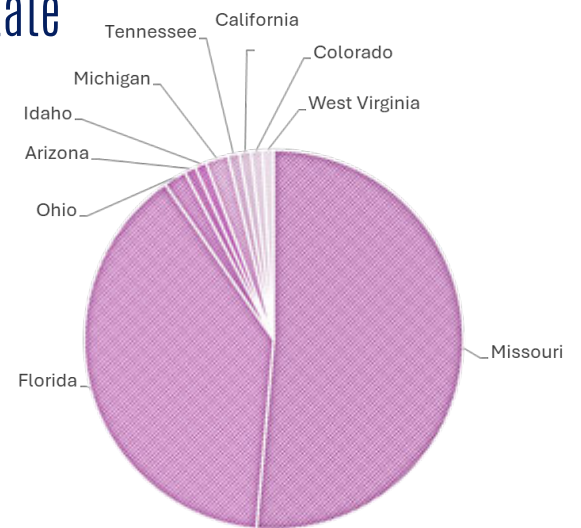
35+ Educational Events Nationwide

\$80,000 to Support Recovery Ecosystems

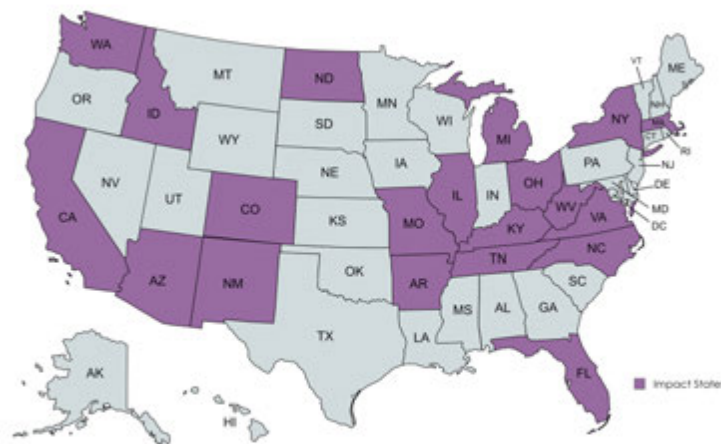

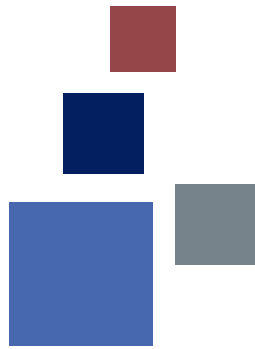
20 States & Growing

500 Peers

In 2023, we brought 500 peers from 18 different states together through the NPRA network. Together, we are building a larger and stronger workforce, and we are helping more people recover.

\$50,000 Invested

In 2023, we invested \$50,000 into workforce development for peer support professionals. This came in the form of supporting NPRA initiatives including the development of our affiliates. It also included partnering with The National Alliance for Recovery Residences (NARR) to help support and build out the peer educational track at the NARR conference in 2024.

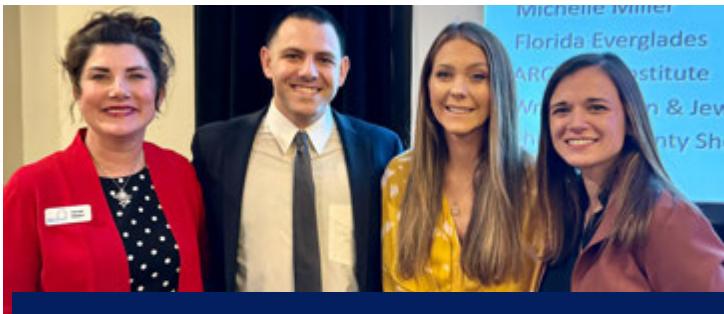
