OUR MISSION & VISION

VISION

We envision long-term recovery for all impacted by substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders.

MISSION

ARCHway Institute serves the **community** by providing education to increase **awareness** and transform perspectives around substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders. As an organization, we advocate for long-term **recovery** by providing peer support and financial assistance to expand access to care and **healthy** solutions.

BARRIERS WE ARE ADDRESSING

- Stigma
- Difficulty in navigating the treatment/recovery system quickly
- Lack of access to wrap around care
- Lack of funding for recovery support services
- Increased need for a sustainable peer workforce

- General Contributions

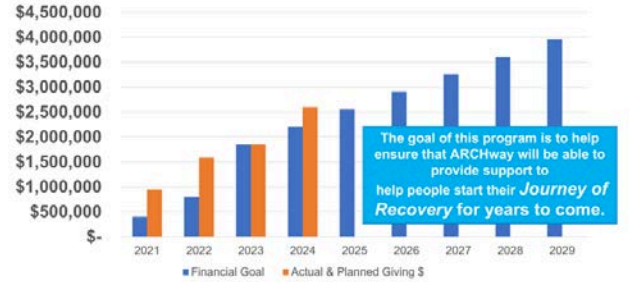

Actual Planned \$ Include Both Future Dollars and Planned Pledged \$ That Have Been Turned Into Actual Donations

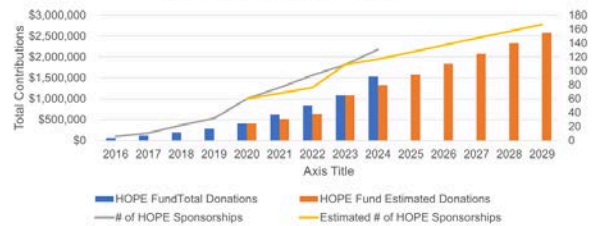
ARCHway's Goal is to Develop \$2 Million Additional in Planned Giving Over The Next 5 Years

STORIES OF HOPE

"In active addiction, my life was completely hopeless. I had no friends, no family and had lost all monetary possessions as well as all my morals. I was so desperate to get help but did not know how to do so, until I went to The Aviary and finally got sober. It was there that my life was saved and I found out about sober living...My counselor told me about The ARCHway Institute and I was able to get help from your foundation that saved my life. They [ARCHway] awarded me a \$500 scholarship that went towards my first month of sober living and kept me off of the streets and helped me in my recovery journey." - Marissa, Scholarship Recipient

"I don't know how to adequately thank you or show my gratitude for the generosity you have shown me on this journey of recovery. I find it utterly astounding that complete strangers would show so much compassion to someone whose disease has wreaked so much devastation in all my relationships and any personal sources of help. I have never been able to ask for help and to have this type of response...Your gift also provided a sense of freedom, financial freedom, so I was able to work on and focus on myself and not the distraction of being too far behind in obligations. Helping others has always felt good but I believe my motives weren't entirely pure. Today I reach out to others in pain, and if nothing else, lend them an ear so they can share. I also volunteer at a local organization called Families in Transition who provide aid in the form of meals, shelter, clothing and mental health and substance abuse resources. STORIES OF HOPE

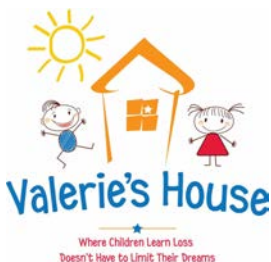


“A former Road to Hope resident shared that they left the program with four years of continuous sobriety under their belt, and while there was also able to graduate college, found permanent employment, and restored their relations with their family. They also achieved independent living and continuous pursuing their education goals as a graduate student. They and their family believe that the Road to Hope and the staff and peers there truly saved their life. They said, ‘The Road to Hope was a bright spot in an otherwise uncertain situation. I will be forever grateful to this place and the staff for what they have done for me and countless others.’”

“A participant came in during the week, having just been released from the county jail. His first move was to come to Landmark. During this first visit to our office, one of our Peer Support Specialists drove him to a treatment facility in our town to get enrolled in outpatient services. Then, they drove him to the local housing authority, to apply for their housing voucher program. His day ended with a ride to the local overnight shelter before we closed, with the guarantee that we would return in the morning to pick him back up to come to our office and work more on his goals. The van allows for us to provide immediate relief to participants’ needs.”

RECOVERY**



“At just 14 years old, Kendra’s world shattered when she witnessed her mother’s fatal overdose. As her mother struggled for breath, her boyfriend cruelly joked about the situation, leaving Kendra not only traumatized by the loss but also deeply betrayed. The experience left her overwhelmed by grief, struggling with anxiety, and feeling lost. With her mother gone, Kendra’s cousin stepped in as her primary caregiver, doing their best to support her through the heartbreak.

In their search for help, they found Valerie’s House. The moment they stepped inside, a sense of hope began to replace the darkness. Valerie’s House provided Kendra with a safe space to process her emotions, and it gave her cousin the guidance they desperately needed to help Kendra heal...Over time, Kendra’s transformation became evident. With the unwavering support of her therapist and peers, she regained her confidence and reignited her passion for learning. Inspired by her journey, Kendra began to dream of enrolling in a nursing program at the local technical college -- something that once seemed impossible in the depths of her grief. Now, she envisions a future where she can turn her pain into purpose, possibly even helping others who have faced similar challenges.

Kendra’s story is a testament to the power of support, resilience, and community. The comprehensive, heart-centered approach at Valerie’s House not only helped her and her cousin heal but also instilled in them a newfound sense of hope. Today, Kendra looks ahead with determination, knowing that her past does not define her future -- her strength does.”

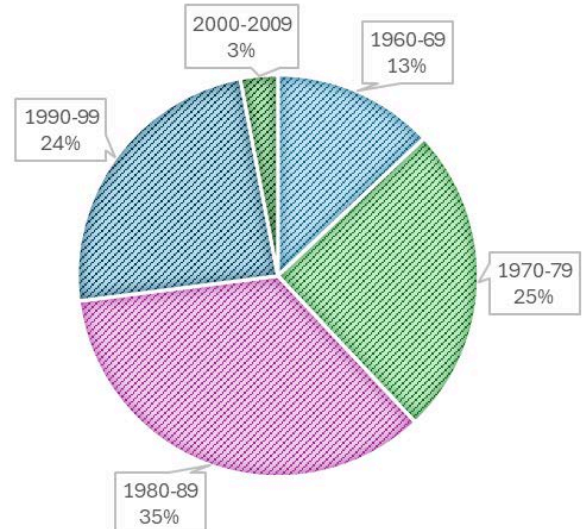
Compounding this is the complexity of our system, which can be overwhelming and discouraging, leaving many feeling hopeless.

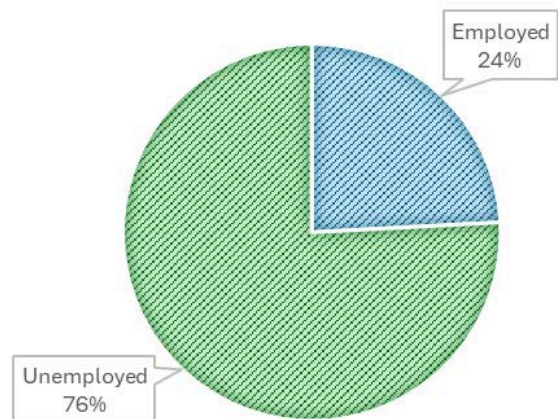
In short, ARCHway is here to support individuals, families, and communities.

The charts on the right give you an idea of those who reach out to ARCHway for help and hope.

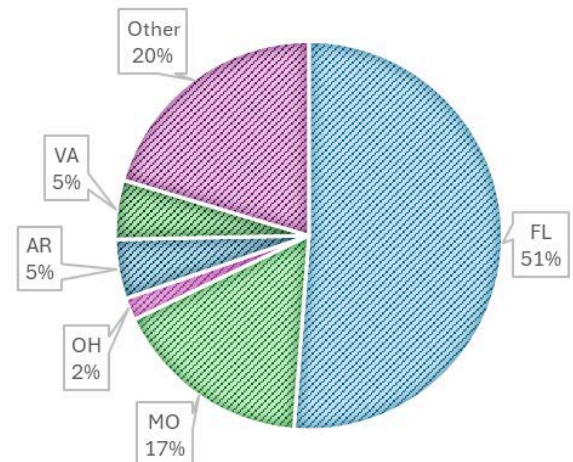
BIRTH YEAR

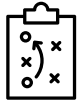

MARCHING FORWARD



5 YEAR STRATEGIC PLANNING

ARCHway will conduct a 5 year strategic plan in 2025! We are excited to continue to develop as an organization and meet the growing needs for those in and seeking recovery. ARCHway has some exciting opportunities just around the corner, so this should be an exciting way to dream big, set goals, and develop our action plan for what the next 5 years will look like for the organization.



GROWTH OF OUR ADVOCATES FOR HOPE PROGRAM

ARCHway has always provided peer support and resource connection for individuals and families who reach out for support. This has been formally named our Advocates for HOPE Program. One of the many values of NPRA as a division of ARCHway is that when someone reaches out to ARCHway, we have a network to locate recovery services across the country. We hope to significantly grow this program in 2025.

ASSIST WITH RECOVERY FRIENDLY WORKPLACES & FAMILY SUPPORT INITIATIVES



ARCHway is working with Dr. David Best and his team to assist in driving peer support, family support, and workplace initiatives to support those in and seeking recovery.

LAUNCH EDUCATION PLATFORM



ARCHway recognizes the value of peer support services in ensuring long-term recovery, so we are working to best support the peer workforce through providing continuing education. Topics will include peer support in justice settings, peer support in recovery housing, ethics, boundaries, self-care, role clarity, and more. There will be a fee for peers to join the platform and get ongoing continuing education to support their certification and professional growth.



ADDITIONAL EVENTS

We are working to add additional events in 2025 including our first conference in Arkansas and a new event in Ohio.



STAFF GROWTH

For the first 8 years of ARCHway's existence, the organization was volunteer run and operated. Today, we have three full time staff members and look to add a 4th in 2025. Staffing for the organization will be considered in our 5 year strategic plan as well. The work is too important to let anything slip because we lack the staff to do it.

JUSTICE INVOLVED PEER SUPPORT TRAINING & CERTIFICATION

ARCHway is working to revise a training for peers within justice settings (i.e. jails, prisons, probation and parole, drug court, etc.). We hope to roll this out by the end of the year. ARCHway will be able to directly certify peers, offering trainings as needed, and we will have a train-the-trainer option.



ANOTHER \$100K IN GRANTS

ARCHway's goal for 2025 is to release another \$100k to increase access to treatment and recovery services.
