## VISION

We envision long-term recovery for all impacted by substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders.

## MISSION

ARCHway Institute serves the **community** by providing education to increase **awareness** and transform perspectives around substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders. As an organization, we advocate for long-term **recovery** by providing peer support and financial assistance to expand access to care and **healthy** solutions.




## Legacy of HOPE – Planned Giving

## ADDITIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- \* We helped to plan and implement two conferences in 2025:
  - The Reach for Recovery Conference in partnership with ARC
  - The National Alliance for Recovery Residences (NARR) Conference - NPRA helped plan and implement the Peer Support track of this conference.
  - We had our first ever conference called The ARCHway Institute Marches Forward in Arkansas!
- \* We have launched a new research project with Dr. David Best focused on studying 60 PRSS. This project brings together multiple organizations that are committed to strengthening the peer workforce.
- \* ARCHway has grown in a powerful way this year as we expanded our leadership team and strengthened our impact. We welcomed back John Stuckey as CEO, Kayla Parsons stepped into the role as Director of Operations, and Mike Tyson joined us as the Executive Director of the National Peer Recovery Alliance. Each Leader brings heart, experience, and vision that will help ARCHway reach more communities and continue building pathways to possibility for all.





# WHAT'S NEW AT ARCHWAY

ARCHway is growing in powerful ways, and this year show just how far our mission is reaching. We added four brand new events that allowed us to connect with more families, more communities, and more people seeking hope. Each event brought its own energy and purpose, expanding our ability to support recovery, strengthening partnerships, and creating spaces where healing can take root. As we continue to grow, ARCHway remains committed to walking alongside individuals and families on their path to possibility, one connection at a time.

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## The ARCHway Institute Marches Forward Conference

The ARCHway Institute Marches Forward Conference in Little Rock Arkansas was a powerful showcase of the recovery ecosystem in Arkansas. The event brought in over **\$14,000 in BRAND NEW sponsorships** and **\$2,500** in registrations, which allowed us to bring 200 individuals together for learning, education, and awareness. It highlighted the collaboration in Arkansas and the commitment so many have to recovery. ARCHway also received a grant from the Arkansas Opioid Recovery Partnership (ARORP) to work with the Arkansas Department of Human Services Prevention team to write a curriculum that will place a prevention specialist in high schools across the state. This conference not only celebrated progress, it helped build the foundation for long term impact in communities across Arkansas. The ARCHway Institute is also proud to share that we received a **\$43,000 grant** from the Arkansas Opioid Recovery Partnership to support a statewide collaboration focused on prevention. These funds will allow us to work alongside prevention partners to develop a comprehensive curriculum designed specifically for prevention specialist serving high schools across the state. This initiative strengthens early intervention efforts and equips schools with practical, recovery informed education to support youth before substance use becomes a crisis.

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## Kick it for Recovery

Kick it for Recovery was a heartfelt and powerful kickball tournament in Freeburg Illinois in partnership with Ryan Easter and Andrew Mueth of Kick it for Recovery, created in honor of their friend Mike Reitzell who tragically lost his battle to an overdose. The event brought the community together for connection, remembrance, and purpose, all while raising over **\$32,000** to support recovery efforts in the Missouri and Illinois region. It was more than a tournament; it was a tribute to Mike's life and a reminder of why this work matters.

# WHAT'S NEW AT ARCHWAY

## Breaking Barriers Ohio Luncheon

The Ohio Breaking Barriers Luncheon in Columbus brought together stakeholders, policy makers, and allies who care deeply about building stronger recovery communities. It was a powerful space to highlight ARCHway initiatives and to talk about the future of workforce development and the importance of second chance employment. We also shared updates on the \$150,000 grant ARCHway received to reshape the peer workforce and career ladder in the state of Ohio. The energy in the room showed that Ohio is ready to keep breaking barriers and creating real opportunities for people in recovery. **Over \$32,000** was raised at this event.



## Connection in the Park: An ARCHway Community Event

Connection in the Park was a brand-new community event in partnership with the Cape Coral Police Department. Through this partnership we received a grant for **\$17,000** to support recovery housing scholarships in Cape Coral Florida along with the ability to make this event happen. Connection in the Park brought together local non-profits, community partners, and allies all to share a commitment to recovery. It created a space for people to learn, connect, and build relationships that will continue to strengthen the recovery ecosystem in Cape Coral.


Compounding this is the complexity of our system, which can be overwhelming and discouraging, leaving many feeling hopeless.


In short, ARCHway is here to support individuals, families, and communities.


## BIRTH YEAR



# THE PATH TO POSSIBILITY

## LAUNCH EDUCATION PLATFORM



ARCHway recognizes the value of peer support services in ensuring long-term recovery, so we are working to best support the peer workforce through providing continuing education. Topics will include peer support in justice settings, peer support in recovery housing, ethics, boundaries, self-care, role clarity, and more. There will be a fee for peers to join the platform and get ongoing continuing education to support their certification and professional growth.



### 5 YEAR STRATEGIC PLANNING

ARCHway will conduct a 5 year strategic plan in 2026! We are excited to continue to develop as an organization and meet the growing needs for those in and seeking recovery. ARCHway has some exciting opportunities just around the corner, so this should be an exciting way to dream big, set goals, and develop our action plan for what the next 5 years will look like for the organization.



### GROWTH OF OUR ADVOCATES FOR HOPE PROGRAM

ARCHway has always provided peer support and resource connection for individuals and families who reach out for support. This has been formally named our Advocates for HOPE Program. One of the many values of NPRA as a division of ARCHway is that when someone reaches out to ARCHway, we have a network to locate recovery services across the country. We hope to significantly grow this program in 2026.

### ASSIST WITH RECOVERY FRIENDLY WORKPLACES & FAMILY SUPPORT INITIATIVES



ARCHway is working with Dr. David Best and his team to assist in driving peer support, family support, and workplace initiatives to support those in and seeking recovery.

### OHIO CONTRACT

ARCHway was granted **150K** to help restructure the peer recovery support in the state of Ohio for 2025 and we just renewed the contract for an additional 150K in 2026! Stefanie Robinson our Ohio NPRA affiliate Director has taken on as head of this initiative expanding our reach even further!

### JUSTICE INVOLVED PEER SUPPORT TRAINING & CERTIFICATION



ARCHway is working to revise a training for peers within justice settings (i.e. jails, prisons, probation and parole, drug court, etc.). We hope to roll this out by the end of the year. ARCHway will be able to directly certify peers, offering trainings as needed, and we will have a train-the-trainer option.

### ANOTHER \$125K IN GRANTS

ARCHway's goal for 2026 is to release another \$125K to increase access to treatment and recovery services.
